February 7-23 Barefoot In The Park Romantic Comedy By Neil Simon	Paul and Corie Bratter are newlyweds in every sense of the word. He's a straight-as-an-arrow lawyer and she's a free spirit always looking for the latest kick. Their new apartment is her most recent find – too expensive with bad plumbing and in need of a paint job. After a six-day honeymoon, they get a surprise visit from Corie's loopy mother and decide to play matchmaker during a dinner with their neighbor-in-the-attic, Velasco, where everything that can go wrong, does. Paul just doesn't understand Corie, as she sees it. He's too staid, too boring, and she just wants him to be a little more spontaneous. Running "barefoot in the park" would be a start...

May 29-June 14 Drop Dead Murder Mystery Comedy By Billy Van Zandt, Jane Milmore	A cast of has-been actors plan to revive their careers in "Drop Dead!," a potboiler murder mystery directed by "Wonder Child of the Broadway Stage" Victor Le Pewe (a psychotic eye twitching megalomaniac). But when the murders and mysteries exceed those in the script - these thespians must save the show and their careers as well as their lives!
July 17-August 2 Present Laughter Comedy By Noël Coward	At the centre of his own universe sits matinee idol Garry Essendine: suave, hedonistic and too old, says his wife, to be having numerous affairs. His line in harmless, infatuated debutantes is largely tolerated but playing closer to home is not. Just before he escapes on tour to Africa the full extent of his misdemeanors is discovered. And all hell breaks loose. Noel Coward's <i>Present Laughter</i> premiered in the early years of the Second World War just as such privileged lives were threatened with fundamental social change.
September 4-20 The Curious Savage Comedy By John Patrick	Mrs. Savage is an elderly woman whose late husband has left her \$10 million dollars. She intends to give the entire fortune away to people who wish to pursue their "foolish dreams," but her stepchildren strongly object. To prevent her from doing away with the family's wealth and ruining their legacy, they have her committed to a sanatorium called The Cloisters, and it is among the gentle residents there that she finds her true family.
October 23-November 8 Blithe Spirit Comedy By Noël Coward	Filled with the sparkling wit and the undeniable charm of Noël Coward, <i>Blithe Spirit</i> is a clever comedy gem from well beyond the grave! As inspiration for his new novel, Charles Condomine invites the wonderfully eccentric medium Madame Arcati to perform a séance in his house. When things go terribly awry, Charles suddenly finds himself caught in an improbable love triangle between his naive living wife and his decidedly "spirited" former wife.
December 4-20 Inspecting Carol Comedy By Daniel Sullivan and The Seattle Repertory Theatre	<i>Inspecting Carol</i> deals with a regional theatre company that is rehearsing its annual production of <i>A Christmas Carol</i> , when it gets news of the impending arrival of an inspector from the National Endowment for the Arts to review their work. When they assume that the man who asks to audition is really an informer for the NEA, everyone caters to the bewildered wannabe actor and he is given a role.
